



DSF 2025 news so far...

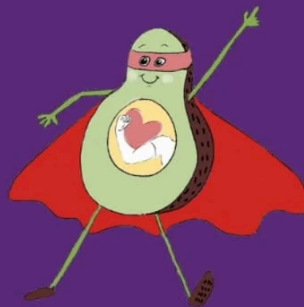

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who attended and supported the night. You continue to make all of this possible.

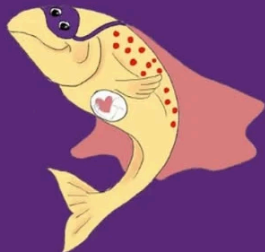

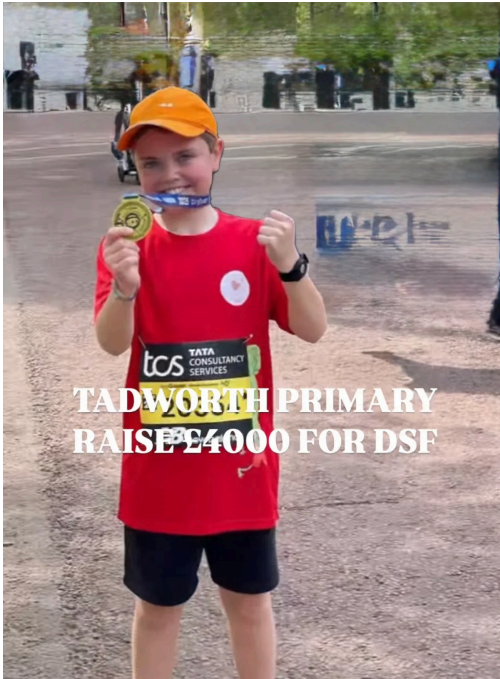
